

The Trans Canada Trail in Alberta: Completed Sections

Leduc Multiway Trail

Type of Trail: All asphalt surfaces

Location: City of Leduc, approximately 20 km south of Edmonton

Historical Perspective: The designated trails are just part of an extensive pathway system.

Terrain: Excellent urban trails, generally with an asphalt surface, extend from near the international airport south and east to the city center, then curve south and west to the city boundary. The route crosses the busy Highway #2 twice, using underpasses.

Access: City of Leduc

Signage: Trans Canada Trail Signage and route maps of all Leduc Multiways

Facilities: The City of Leduc has full facilities

Points of Interest: Telford Lake, a semi-natural park near downtown. The trails are part of an extensive pathway system. The city hopes to connect to the airport in the near future, allowing both visitors and those working in the airport to access the airport by bicycle.

Length: 10 km (approximately 6 ¼ miles)

Surface: Asphalt

Width: 2.5 meters (8.20 feet)

Permitted Uses: Hiking, walking, cycling, cross country skiing, rollerblading, wheelchair
